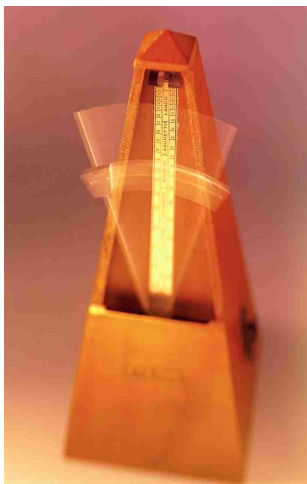

SPRING FESTIVAL

Event: Spring Festival is back this year! We will hold the 2007 Spring Festival in the newly renovated French Parlor on the beautiful campus of USD. The date will be Saturday, May 12th, the day before Mother's Day. In honor of this special weekend, our theme will be "Women Composers," to celebrate the music of these influential mothers.

This is a non-competitive event, which means no winners will be chosen. However, the Spring Festival will be adjudicated, and every participant will receive an evaluation. Each participant will also receive a trophy for their performance in this Festival.

Date: Saturday, May 12th (the day before Mother's Day)

Time: There will be a total of eight recitals, starting at 9:00 AM, 10:00 AM, 11:00 AM, 12:30 PM, 1:30 PM, 2:30 PM, 3:30 PM and 4:30 PM.

Location: The French Parlor inside Founders Hall on the campus of USD

Theme: Women Composers (in honor of Mother's Day). A woman composer could be a renowned classical composer (e.g. Clara Schumann or Amy Beach). This theme can also include pedagogical works by women (e.g. Jane Bastien or Martha Mier). However, please refrain from using transcriptions, arrangements, and pop music for this festival

Rules:

1. Each teacher may enter a maximum of five students.
2. The maximum time limit for each student is 5 minutes.
3. The student must perform the piece memorized.
4. The student must provide an original score for the evaluators.
5. The piece can be for one performer on one piano, or two performers on one piano.
6. Instrumentalists and vocalists are welcome to participate. However, instrumental and vocal participants must provide their own accompanist.
7. Each teacher that has students in the Spring Festival must be present at the festival and help out during the recitals in which their students participate.
8. Evaluations from the adjudicators will be mailed out after the festival.

Deadline for application: April 12th, 2007

PIANO DUO FESTIVAL

The MTAC Branch Piano Duo Festival will take place on **Saturday, May 26**, 2007 at Greene Music in San Diego. Deadline for this event is **May 12th**, 2007. Entry fee per team is \$40.00. Register your students on the MTAC website at sandiegomtac.com. Make one check per studio (drawn on the teacher's account) and mail to Lin Chu.

The categories are as follows:

- Category 1 (ages 5-9)-limit 3 minutes
- Category 2 (ages 10-12)-limit 4 minutes
- Category 3 (ages 13-15)-limit 5 minutes
- Category 4 (ages 16-high school)-limit 7 minutes

Awards in addition to certificates will be given to deserving teams. Music must be original for 4 hands or two pianos. Younger students must enter in the higher age category if paired with an older student. Teams may not repeat repertoire from last year's program.

**MTAC-SAN DIEGO BRANCH
CONCERTO COMPETITION**

February 3-4, 2007

University of San Diego Shiley Theatre (Camino Hall)

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Open to students of MTAC Members-San Diego Branch.
2. Students must have studied at least 6 months with entering teacher.

CLASSIFICATION AND DIVISIONS:

Division I	Piano through age 11
Division II	Piano 12-14 years old
Division III	Piano 15-18 years old
Division IV	Wind Instruments through age 18
Division V	String Instruments through age 18

AWARDS:

Judges may select a First, Second and Third Place winner from each division. The First-Place winners will perform with an orchestra in the San Diego area during the spring or early summer. Second-Place winners are considered alternates.

Winners and Honorable Mentions will be announced immediately following the completion of each division. Awards will be presented to all winners at that time. Each contestant will receive a Certificate of Participation after his/her performance.

AUDITION PROCEDURES:

- Each contestant is given 10 minutes maximum.
- Orchestral parts must be played on a second piano.
- Teachers cannot accompany their own students.
- Photocopied music at the performance will result in disqualification.
- NOTE: *No previous winner can compete in the same division. No winner can compete with the same concerto in a different division.*

REPERTOIRE:

- One complete movement of a work for soloist and orchestra. Please keep in mind that Twentieth-century concertos by composers such as Barber, Bartok, Prokofieff and Scriabin may be too difficult for the accompanying orchestra.
- All performances must be from memory.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

1. Use online registration. **DEADLINE JANUARY 15**

SCJ BACH FESTIVAL

SCJ Bach Festival will be held on **April 14, 2007 (Saturday)** in La Mesa United Methodist Church. Only **Active Teacher members** may enter students in SCJ Bach Festival.

No limit will be placed on the number of student from any studio participating at a Branch Festival since the purpose of the festival is to encourage students to study and perform the works of J.S. Bach.

Students playing instruments other than organ shall not have reached their 19th birthday by April 1, 2007; organists, their 22nd birthday. A teacher should not present any students as one's own until after an enrollment of 6 months unless by consent of the former teacher. Student may play more than one instrument but may appear **only once** on each instrument at any one Branch or Regional Festival.

REPertoire:

At the branch level, students may play any **original music of J.S. Bach** or music of other Baroque composers. However, to be eligible to play in the Regional Festival, the following exceptions must be kept:

No music from the Anna Magdalena Bach Notebook, ANH 113-132

No works by other Baroque composers.

Music need not be limited to the Complete Works Audition Official List of Bach's works in order to be eligible for Regional Festival. Music from the current Official List is required **ONLY** at Complete Works Audition.

Printed Application form, Student Evaluation Sheet (3 copies for every student), master list of students, 2 (small and big) self-addressed stamped envelopes, and one check for all entering students, drawn on the teacher's account made payable to " MTAC SD Branch", should be postmarked no later than **March 10, 2007 (Wednesday)**. **No Exceptions**. Please, print Application form and Student Evaluation Sheet only from our branch website.

Application fee: \$20 per student.

The following rules will be strictly enforced:

1. Time limit for Branch and Regional Festivals is **5 minutes** and also at the Complete Works Audition. Multiple pieces must be from the same work or as categorized on the CWA list.
2. All music is to be **performed by memory**, except in categories XVII Organ, XX Flute, XXV Ensembles, where memorization is optional.
3. Repeats in repertoire are optional.
4. Student must perform the same music and in the same category, at the Branch and Regional Festivals, and also for the Complete Works Audition, but complete as shown on the Complete Works List.
5. No student may use the same piece nor use the same movement or section of a work he presented at any preceding year at Regional.
6. Transfer students must have consent **in writing** from the previous teacher in order to participate in SCJ Bach Festival if the student has been with the new teacher less than 6 months.
7. No student may use the same piece nor use the same composition, or any part thereof, that was presented in any preceding year at Complete Works Audition, except for the Goldberg Variations.
8. In order to be eligible for CWA, student with works from the Complete Works List must be a winner at Branch and Regional Festivals.
9. Students selected for first, second, and third place in the CWA must be present at the Memorial Awards Program in order to receive their medal.
10. Accompaniments for keyboard concerto are required for the CWA with the exception of the Concerto for two keyboards. Accompaniments are optional at the Branch and Regional level. Teachers may not accompany their own students. All movements of the Concerto are required for Complete Works.
11. Students **MAY NOT PRESENT** photocopied music to the judges and accompanist may not use photocopied music.
12. All fees are non-refundable.
13. Teachers, students, and parents **are prohibited** from personal contact with judges before, during and after the competition.

Special thanks to all of the teachers for their help at the Bach Festival last year. If we all want SCJ Bach Festival to be successful, pleasant and memorable event to our students, every teacher M U S T contribute their time and help to carry out this competition.

VOCE UPDATE for 2007**Teachers Please note:**

1. Competitive and non-competitive performers are welcome.
2. **Pianists are welcome** to enter this competition in CHAMBER MUSIC ENSEMBLES.

DUOS - Major sonatas for piano and either a wind or string instrument, in which the piano score is written as an equal part and not as an accompaniment, can be considered an ensemble.

INSTRUMENTAL ENSEMBLE - This will include piano trios, piano quartets and piano quintets. There is even a piece written for piano, voice and strings by Shostakovich's Suite on Romances on Poems of Alexander Blok, Op 127 which may qualify for this category since voice is only one "instrument" among 4 (piano trio plus soprano).

Personally, being a pianist and a collaborative artist, I feel that it is most important in the training of a young pianist that they have experience in chamber music ensembles. It changes the way they approach music, and molds their concept of nuances, voicing, harmony, counterpoint and ensemble. – Mary Au, VOCE

The 2007 MTAC-San Diego Branch VOCE Competition Recital February 11, 2007

The 2007 MTAC-San Diego Branch VOCE Competition Recital will be held on February 11, 2007 at Hammond Ashley Violins in San Diego. This VOCE competition recital is open to students of all MTAC members in good standing. Additionally, all contestants must have studied with their MTAC member teacher for at least six months. All students who do not qualify to compete in the VOCE competition (e.g. students of non-MTAC members) may also participate in the 2007 MTAC-San Diego Branch VOCE recital on a non-competitive basis. Non-competitive participants in the VOCE recital will receive evaluation comments from the judges; but they will not be eligible for advancement in the VOCE process.

First Place Winners from the San Diego Branch (chosen from the competition contestants from each category) may advance to the State Finals Competition. First Place Winners of the State Finals Competition will be asked to perform on the VOCE Recital at the 2007 MTAC State Convention in July, where they will receive their cash awards (see VOCE Guidelines 2006-2007 for detail). Eligibility

1. Open to Vocalists, Orchestral Instrumentalists, and Chamber Music Ensembles (including pianists) who are students of all MTAC-San Diego Branch members in good standing.
2. Students must have studied at least 6 months with entering teacher.
3. Non-qualifying students (e.g. non MTAC member students) may participate in the 2007 MTAC-San Diego Branch VOCE competition/recital on a non-competitive basis.
4. Major sonatas for piano and either a wind or string instrument, in which the piano score is written as an equal part and not as an accompaniment, can be considered an ensemble. Sonatas played in the Ensemble category should be played with music.
5. Please refer to Guidelines for VOCE 2006-2007 for details.

Categories

1. Age limit is as of February 1 of the year of competition.
2. Solo Voice: Intermediate (age 17 & under), Senior (age 18 - 23)
3. Solo String: Junior (age 12 and under), Intermediate (age 13-15), Senior (age 16 - 18)
4. Solo Wind: Intermediate (age 15 and under), Senior (age 16 - 20)
5. Instrumental Ensemble of 2-5 students: Intermediate (average age 15 and under) Senior (average age 16 - 20)
6. Vocal Ensemble of 3-5 students: Senior (average age 23 & under)
7. Please refer to online VOCE Guidelines 2006-2007 for details.

Repertoire

1. All pieces must be memorized (including sonatas) by competitive performers in Solo categories.
2. Sonatas played in the Ensemble category should be played with music.
3. Performance from memory is optional for non-competitive performers.
4. Contrasting selections from different periods (Baroque, Classical, Romantic/Impressionistic, and Contemporary) with different styles and tempi for Instrumentalists and Ensembles.
5. Three selections in the original language using English and two other languages for Vocalists.
6. Please refer to online VOCE Guidelines 2006-2007 for details.

Awards

1. Judges may select a First, Second and Third Place winner for each category.
2. Ties are allowed.
3. Alternates may be chosen for each category.
4. At the recommendation of the judging panel, the First place winners may advance to the State Finals competition. In the event a First Place Winner cannot perform at the State Finals, the Alternate Winner for that category will be asked to take his or her place.
5. Each performer will receive a Certificate of Participation.
6. Winners and Honorable Mentions will be announced immediately following the completion of the 2007 MTAC-San Diego Branch VOCE Competition Recital. Awards will be presented to all winners at that time.

Application Form

1. All application forms must be printed on **yellow paper**.
2. Please view <http://www.mtac.org/programs/voce/VOCE2007Application.pdf> to download or fill in application form. You can also go online to www.mtac.org, click on "VOCE" (from the left list) then click on "VOCE Application Form" to download the VOCE application form.
3. You will need to "select text" on your computer to fill out the application on your computer and print it out.
4. You can also print out the application form and type on it manually.

Fees

1. Fee applies to both competitive and non-competitive performers
2. \$50 for each Solo performer
3. \$35 for each Ensemble member (per performer)

Audition Procedures

1. Each contestant is given 9 minutes maximum performance time.
2. All music requiring piano accompaniment (including concerto) must have an accompanist.
3. Each performer should provide a copy of music (piano score) to the judging panel. No photocopies please.
4. Use of photocopies by students at the performance or for judges will disqualify the contestant.
5. Judges have the right to stop a contestant during a piece for time consideration.
6. Judges may choose whether or not to hear a cadenza.
7. The judging panel reserves the right to not select a First place winner in every category if the contestants are not sufficiently qualified.
8. The decision of the judges is final.
9. Please refer to the Guidelines for VOCE 2006-2007 for details.

Application procedures

1. Use online application form and print form on **yellow paper**
2. Send completed application form (printed on yellow paper)
3. Send Proof of age (e.g. birth certificate, passport)
4. Send application fee (one check per entry for total amount drawn on the teacher's account) **made payable to MTAC San Diego Branch**. Please write student performer's name on the memo field of each check.
5. Send one large stamped and self addressed manila envelope (9x10 or 10x13). Please make sure that the address is the entering teacher's address and not the student's home address.
